# STEVENSON INSTRUMENTAL MUSIC PROGRAM

## COURSE OFFERINGS: THIS IS WHAT WE DO

- *The SHS Instrumental Music Program has been recognized as one of the top music programs in the State of Michigan*
- *Participating in High School band classes does not interfere with other after-school activities like athletics*
- *Participating in High School band does not interfere with college prep classes. Being in Band **does** meet the Fine Arts requirement for High School graduation in Michigan*
- *SHS Instrumental Music students usually have the opportunity to take an educational trip each spring. Past trips have included New York City at Carnegie Hall, Disney World, Washington D.C., performing for Presidents Bush and Clinton., Virginia Beach, Chicago, Nashville, Cleveland, and Cincinnati. All Spring trips are voluntary*
- *Our Band Booster organization raises funds for the students involved with the Instrumental Music Program. These fundraisers help to support the students' overall Instrumental Music experience*
- *Participating in Marching Band as a junior high student provides a head start to high school. Students will know upperclassmen and those older experienced students can help with classes, transportation, school activities, schedules, finding your way around SHS, and knowledge of the SHS teachers*

**J040-Concert Band- Open to any student.** Concert Band is a full year course that provides the opportunity for participation, study and individual achievement. Classes are devoted to further training in techniques, Music Theory, Ear Training, student composition, sight-reading and to individual progress. Because this is a performing group, members will be required to attend all rehearsals and performances.

**J050-Symphonic Band- Instructor recommendation required.** Symphonic Band is a full year course that provides the advanced band student an understanding and appreciation of music either as a performer or listener and an academic approach to the presentation of public performances. Classes are devoted to further training in techniques, Music Theory, Ear Training, student composition, sight-reading and to individual progress. Because this is a performing group, members will be required to attend all rehearsals and performances.

**J055-Varsity Band (Wind Ensemble)- Instructor recommendation required.** Wind Ensemble is a full year course that provides the advanced band student an understanding and appreciation of music either as a performer or listener and an academic approach to the presentation of public performances through College level music. Classes are devoted to further training in techniques Music Theory, Ear Training, student composition, sight-reading and to individual progress. Because this is a performing group, members will be required to attend all rehearsals and performances.

# STEVENSON INSTRUMENTAL MUSIC PROGRAM

## COURSE OFFERINGS: THIS IS WHAT WE DO

**J070-Jazz Band- Instructor recommendation required.** Jazz Band is a full year course that is a performing group that consists of instrumental students who wish to perform various styles of the Jazz idiom. Improvisation will be a main component of this class along with Music Theory, Ear Training, student composition and sight-reading. Because this is a performing group, members will be required to attend all rehearsals and performances.

**J060-Solo & Ensemble/Stevenson Band-** This full year course is a great opportunity for students to learn new instruments, enhance abilities on their current instruments, improve their performance level in our other ensembles, and/or gain exposure to the requirements for Jazz Band. Students in this class will be encouraged to learn and perform with our performance ensembles.

**Marching Band (co-curricular)-** Secondary students in the Stevenson cluster that are interested in the Titan Marching Band may join! **Students must be enrolled in a band class to participate as an instrumentalist.**  
*Note: Colorguard members do not need to be in band*  
The Marching Band meets together daily for about two weeks during August and then after school one day a week through mid-October.

Two years of Marching Band qualifies to receive flex credit for High School Physical Education Credit (1/2 year)! Full participation at every performance and rehearsal is required for eligibility.

*Through learning about music, rehearsals, and performances, it is our goal that the students of the Instrumental Music Program become:*

- *Creative problem solvers who can think critically and can make decisions through artistic modes and in situations where there are no standard answers*
- *Culturally aware citizens who have a sense of history and an appreciation for the Fine Arts through multicultural experiences*
- *Humanistic thinkers that are creative and sensitive*
- *Collaborative workers who are self-confident, receptive to others' ideas, and utilize peer input to develop interpersonal relationships within the framework of their learning*

# STEVENSON INSTRUMENTAL MUSIC PROGRAM COURSE OFFERINGS: BRINGING IT ALL TOGETHER

Students that attend Utica Community Schools, and specifically Stevenson High School, are fortunate to have many different options and learning pathways to explore their interests and prepare for their lives beyond high school.

## Band can be part of the curriculum all throughout Junior and High School for all students

We believe strongly in giving students that wish to participate in Instrumental Music the opportunity to do so while also working collaboratively to meet every student's other academic interests and needs. Recent legislation has made it easier for students exploring music to do so by utilizing Flex Options as part of their scheduling plan - no matter if they are a traditional student or enrolled in specialty program such as CSI, MST, or Stevenson MADE. Current Flex Options include:

- Substituting two complete seasons of Marching Band in place of the graduation requirement of ½ credit (one semester) of Physical Education
- Taking a second full year of an in-school Band Class (two semesters) in place of the graduation requirement of a second full year of World Language.

*Important note: Some, but not all, colleges/universities require at least two years of the same World Language for admission. It is advisable to explore the requirements of any college or university you plan on applying to in advance of completing your high school schedules.*

The schedules that follow are simplified for clarity. For example, many students will have flexibility in which years/semesters they take Economics, Government, Science, and Social Studies classes. Always consult with the Stevenson Counseling Department to ensure you are on track to meet graduation requirements.

Two full seasons of Marching Band can be used to substitute the requirement for 1/2 credit (one semester) of physical education (Flex Option).

**Students that don't complete the Flex Option requirement through an alternative activity (such as two seasons of Marching Band) must add 1/2 credit (one semester) of Physical Education as one of their electives to the sample schedule outlines that follow:**

#### Schedule reference notes:

1. One full year (two semesters) of band fulfills the Visual, Performance, and Applied Arts requirement
2. Second full year of band fulfills 2nd Year of World Language requirement (Flex Option)
3. 3rd and 4th years of bands as electives
4. Due to the requirements of the MST curriculum, students taking 8 semesters of Band must work with the Stevenson Counseling department to establish a Personal Curriculum to fulfill their required 1/2 credit of Health. MST students that do not complete two full seasons of Marching Band must also complete their Physical Education requirement.
5. As of early 2020, the specific curriculum for the senior year for Stevenson MADE students is being developed. Similar to students enrolled in CSI or MST, MADE students enrolling in 9th grade will have a pathway to graduation that can include taking a Band class all four years. MADE students first enrolling in 10th grade must make-up their MADE 9 Elective and cannot take band in 10th grade.

## FUNDRAISING

## SUPPORT ACTIVITIES

### Chaperones and Logistics

Band Boosters' parents and guardians play an important role in the success of the Instrumental Music Program by providing volunteers to help chaperone activities, provide logistical support during the outdoor Marching Band season, and more.

### Donations

The Boosters publish several requests for donations:

- Non-perishable items that will be consumed by the Marching Band during the season. These donations provide a huge boost to the kids when they need quick snacks, bottled water, and more.
- Food for Booster-planned game day dinners during Marching season

### Uniforms

Volunteers are needed annually for sizing and distributing / collecting attire for both Marching Band and Concert Ensembles.

### Helping Hands

The Band Boosters annually set aside funds received through donations that assist those that would not otherwise be able to participate in Band. These funds are a hand up, not a hand out.

If there are extenuating circumstances causing you to have trouble paying for a band activity, please contact Mr. Sekich for more information on the possible availability of assistance through the Band Boosters. Don't wait until you have a past due balance.

- Students accepting Helping Hands funds are not eligible for Spring travel during that school year
- Helping Hands contributions are limited to \$500 lifetime per student
- Eligibility is determined by Mr. Sekich with consultation with the Band Boosters and SHS administrators

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
